

An Order of Compline

From the Anglican Book of Common Prayer

The Lord Almighty grant us a quiet night and a perfect end. Amen

O God, make speed to save us;
O Lord, make haste to help us.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;
As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end.

Praise ye the Lord;
The Lord's Name be praised.

Then shall be said or sung one or more of the following Psalms; Psalm 4; Psalm 31.6; Psalm 91; Psalm 134; or any other Psalm or Psalms.

Thou, O Lord, art in the midst of us, and we are called by thy name. Leave us not, O Lord our God.

Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart; and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.

Was crucified, dead, and buried:

He ascended into heaven,
And sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty;
From thence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead.
I believe in the Holy Spirit;
The holy Catholic Church;
The Communion of Saints;
The Forgiveness of sins;
The Resurrection of the body,
And the Life everlasting. Amen

And after these prayers following, all devoutly kneeling:

Blessed art thou, O God of our fathers;
To be praised and glorified above all for ever.

Let us bless the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit;
Let us praise Him and magnify Him for ever.

Blessed art thou, O Lord, in the firmament of heaven;
To be praised and glorified above all for ever.

The Almighty and most merciful Lord guard us and give us his blessing.
Amen

Then the Minister and people say together the Confession and the Prayer for Forgiveness following:

WE confess to God Almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit,
that we have sinned in thought, word and deed,
through our own grievous fault.
Wherefore we pray God to have mercy upon us.

Almighty God, have mercy upon us,
forgive us all our sins and deliver us from all evil,
confirm and strengthen us in all goodness,
and bring us to life everlasting;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

If a Priest be present, he/she shall pronounce the following Absolution:

MAY the Almighty and merciful Lord
grant unto you pardon and remission of all your sins,
time for amendment of life,
and the grace and comfort of the Holy Spirit. Amen

Then shall be said:

Wilt thou not turn again and quicken us;
That thy people may rejoice in thee?

O Lord, show thy mercy upon us;
And grant us thy salvation.

Vouchsafe, O Lord, to keep us this night without sin;
O Lord, have mercy upon us.

O Lord, hear our prayer;
And let our cry come unto thee.

The Collect For Protection

Visit, we beseech thee, O Lord, this place,
and drive from it all the snares of the enemy;
let thy holy angels dwell herein to preserve us in peace;
and may thy blessing be upon us evermore;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Or

Lighten our darkness, we beseech thee, O Lord;
and by thy great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night;
for the love of thy only Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

The following prayers may be added.

Look down, O Lord, from thy heavenly throne,
illuminate the darkness of this night with thy celestial brightness,
and from the sons of light banish the deeds of darkness;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Be present, O merciful God,
and protect us through the silent hours of this night,
so that we who are wearied by the
changes and chances of this fleeting world,
may repose upon thy eternal changelessness;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

We will lay us down in peace and take our rest;
For it is thou, Lord, only, that makest us dwell in safety.

The Lord be with you;
And with thy spirit.

Let us bless the Lord;
Thanks be to God.

THE Almighty and merciful Lord,
the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit,
bless and preserve us. *Amen.*
